The Randleman High School varsity football team has been forced to deal with an incredible challenge as head coach Shane Timmons left the team earlier this season in order to be with his family in Tennessee as his young daughter continues to fight brain

"Everything that happened with Coach Timmons has brought us together more," said starting sophomore quarterback John Kirkpatrick, who threw six touchdown passes in a 42-14 win over Providence Grove last week. "We are all playing as well as we should be. We're playing for Coach Timmons."

Hughes said although the coaching staff has certainly done their part, it's the players who have shown incredible resilience during a tough time.

"They do talk about it, they care about it," Hughes said of his team dealing with losing their head coach. "It's really all about them. They made a decision that we are going to keep this going and that's what they have done. Coach Timmons has built this the past two or three years and it's made it easier for the seniors to lead."

Of course, no one is sure when or if Timmons will return this season. All that is sure is that a group of players and their coaching staff are performing as well as possible while dealing with a very difficult situation.
